

Ecological conservation and ecosystem services

- Natural processes, natural hydrological and natural hydromorphological regime and the corridor function of rivers to be preserved and/or restored
- Ecological connectivity improved and maintained
- Long-term positive influence on the conservation of key species and habitats

- Socio-economic sustainable development and livelihood
 - Traditional cultural landscapes preserved through the stimulation and revitalisation of traditional, nature-friendly and extensive practices of land (and river) use
 - High standards of sustainability in all sectors reducing the negative impact on nature and improving the habitat quality

• Livelihood, security and wellbeing of local people through sustainable

economic activities such as sustainable tourism

Logistic support and capacity building

- Appropriate capacities and mechanisms to address both conservation and sustainable development issues
- State-of-the-art research and monitoring programmes, educational and awareness raising activities for a better understanding of natural values as well as conservation and restoration requirements
- Foster the image of one connected region





Transboundary management and cooperation

- Management based on best available practice, experience and knowledge, stakeholder participation and transboundary cooperation
- Broad common understanding of river ecosystems and natural values
- High level scientific and technical cooperation
- Sufficient resources for institutional development
