



# **Danube Transnational Programme**

## Call announcement for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Call for Proposals

9th May 2017

## 1. Introduction

The Danube Transnational Programme is launching the **second call for proposals for its priorities 1, 2 and 3.** The Programme offers financial support to transnational projects contributing to the development of a more innovative, better accessible and sustainable Danube Region. The programme has been designed under the territorial cooperation goal of the European Union. In practice, the programme combines financing from the EU structural funds - European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) and the EU external funds – Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance (IPA II) and European Neighbourhood Instrument (ENI).

## 2. Objectives and priorities

Danube Transnational Programme supports the policy **integration in the Danube area** through projects addressing key challenges and opportunities of the region. The strategic vision is "policy integration" in specific fields of action below the EU-level (not duplicating efforts in policy integration at the EU-level e.g. TEN-T) and above the national level. Transnational projects should influence national, regional and local policies (policy driver).

In order to achieve a higher degree of territorial integration of the very heterogeneous Danube region, the transnational cooperation programme will act as a **policy driver** aiming to tackle the common challenges and needs deriving from specific policy fields. Therefore, transnational cooperation is expected to deliver tangible results through the **development and practical implementation of policy frameworks, tools and services**. To this end, the programme looks to promote concrete pilot investments.

The Second call for proposals is open to the Specific Objectives 1.2, 2.2, 2.3, 2.4 and 3.2, restricted to specific topics for the other SOs, and closed for SO 4.1, according to the following table:

In the restricted Specific Objectives, only the topics addressed and outlined in the table above will be considered for financing, based on the quality assessment.

## 3. Funds allocated for the call and co-financing

The programme will allocate up to **50,834,974.48 EUR of ERDF, 4,420,498.53 EUR of IPA and 4,653,192.00 EUR of ENI** to the second call for proposals. The maximum EU contribution to the projects is 85% (for ERDF, IPA and ENI project partners).

#### 4. Timeframe

The call will be open from **09.05.2017.** 

The AF and its annexes have to be submitted to the Joint Secretariat **by 15:00 Central European Time on 06.06.2017** through this link: <u>http://www.interreg-danube.eu/calls/calls-for-proposals/second-call-for-proposals/dtp-second-call-for-proposals-application-form</u>.

### 5. Duration of projects

The duration of projects must not exceed **36 months**. This limit applies for the operative phase of the project and does not comprise the preparation phase.

### 6. LP principle

Each project has to appoint a lead partner who is responsible for preparation and submission of the application form. In case of approval of the project, the lead partner takes over the full responsibility for management, communication, implementation, and coordination of activities among the involved partners. The lead partner bears legal responsibility for the whole partnership. The lead partner is also the link between the project and the Managing Authority/Joint Secretariat (MA/JS) of the Programme.

The following institutions can be lead partners:

- Local, regional, national public bodies/ bodies governed by public law (including EGTCs in the meaning of Article 2(16) of Regulation (EU) No 1303/2013)
- International organisations
- Private non-profit bodies



Lead Partners have to be located in an EU Member State of the Programme Area.

## 7. Eligible partners

The following institutions are eligible to apply:

- Local, regional, national public bodies/ bodies governed by public law officially registered in the Programme Area (including EGTCs in the meaning of Article 2(16) of Regulation (EU) No 1303/2013 registered in one country the programme area)
- International organisations
- Private bodies (including private enterprises registered in a EU Member State of the programme area)

Availability of ENI funds for partners from Moldova and Ukraine will be under the condition that the revised DTP Cooperation Programme is officially adopted by the EC and the Financing Agreements between the concerned countries, the EC and the MA/JS are signed.

Compliance of the control systems of the partner states and conclusion of Financing Agreement for IPA/ENI countries are conditions for the reimbursement of the partners of the approved projects.

### 8. Partnership requirements

The Programme covers 14 countries, 9 of them EU Member States (Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Hungary, Germany-Baden Württemberg and Bayern, Romania, Slovakia and Slovenia) and 5 non-member states (Bosnia and Herzegovina, Republic of Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia and Ukraine). As a general rule, EU financing is only provided to project partners located in the Programme Area.

Each project has to involve at least **three financing partners from three different countries** of the programme area: the Lead Partner and at least two project partners. Out of these financing partners, at least one, the Lead Partner, has to be located on the territory of an EU Member state of the Programme area.

### <u>Applicants located outside the programme area but within the EU are not eligible to apply</u> for funding as project partners in the 2<sup>nd</sup> call.



#### 9. One step procedure

The second call of the Danube Transnational Programme is organised according to a one-step procedure. Applicants are requested to submit electronically, through the programme website, the Application Package, including a fully developed Application Form (AF), which will contain in-depth information about the content and it will be the basis for the selection of the project proposals.

The following documents, part of the Application Package, are compulsory to be submitted:

- > Application Form
- > Declaration of co-financing (for all ERDF/IPA/ENI partners)
- State aid declaration (for all ERDF/IPA/ENI partners)
- Partnership Agreement
- > Declaration for International Organisations (only if applicable)
- > ASP declaration (only if applicable)

The application and selection procedure is detailed in PART 4 of the Applicants Manual.

#### **Application process:**

- The Application Form, composed by a PDF, an Excel document and its annexes, part of the Application Package, can be downloaded <u>here</u> and have to be submitted through this <u>link.</u>
- All selected proposals will go through a condition clearing exercise, where, among other requirements to be fulfilled, the final project data will have to be inserted in the DTP electronic data exchange system (eMS).

#### **10. Programme Language**

The official language of the programme is English. Therefore, all communication between applicants and the MA/JS is carried out in English. Information in application forms as well as official correspondence must be treated accordingly.
